New Records Set at Central Florida Gliders 19th Annual Spring Track Classic

Altamonte Springs, FL – With clear skies and slight breezes to offset the hot Central Florida temperatures, 15 new meet records were set at the Central Florida Gliders 19th Annual Spring Track Classic, held April 30 at Lake Brantley High School in Altamonte Springs, Florida. Nearly 700 athletes of all ages attended the track and field meet, representing teams and individuals from across Florida, Georgia, the Bahamas, and the United Kingdom.

“It was great to see athletes of all ages participating in our sport,” stated Craig D. Wise, meet director and coach/executive director of the Central Florida Gliders. Rarely does the public get the chance to see youth, adult, and international athletes compete in the same meet. Additionally, we had 15 records broken, reflecting the high caliber competitors in this meet.”

Primary age group (born 2003 and after) sprinter **Tamari Davis** from the Gainesville Striders broke 2006 and 2002 records for the girls 100 meter and 200 meter dash, respectively, with times of 14.21 in the 100-meter dash and 29.7 in the 200-meter dash.

New records were set in the Youth (born 1997-1998) girls 200-meter dash, 800-meter run, and 100-meter hurdles. **Kaylin Whitney** from Break Away track club in Clermont placed first with a time of 25.69 in the 200 meter. **Jessica Brinson** of Jacksonville’s Epitome track club set the pace for the 800-meter race with a 2:25.58. **Domonique Turner** of Orlando shaved .45 seconds off the 2000 record with her 15.16 run in the 100-meter hurdles.

Lavonne Idlette shattered the 2004 record in the Open women’s (born 1982-1996) 100-meter hurdles with a time of 13.54. **Ariel Moore** tied the meet record for Open women’s high jump, jumping 5 feet or 1.52 meters. **Amber Bledsloe** leapt 18 feet 11 inches in the Open women’s long jump, passing last year’s record by 1 inch. **Jade Stokes** from the Savannah-Chatham Silver Cheetahs blasted past the 2002 record for Open women’s shot put with a strong throw of 42 feet 11.5 inches.

Records fell in the Midget (born 1999-2000) boys 200-meter and mile events as **Terrell Wright** from the Epitome track club placed first with a 25.12 finishing time in the 200-meter and **Alexander Boucher** of Altamonte Springs’ Central Florida Gliders clocked in with a 5:21.14 run in the mile race. The previous meet record for the mile was also broken by **Jaylen Rodriques** of the Evolution Speed running club, who came in second with a time of 5:21.20.

Max Robinson of the Central Florida Gliders finished first in the Youth (born 1997-1998) boys mile event, breaking the previous record with his 4:52.93 finish. **Jamari Johnson** of the CCTT track team set a new record for the Youth boys shot put with his throw of 45 feet 8 inches.

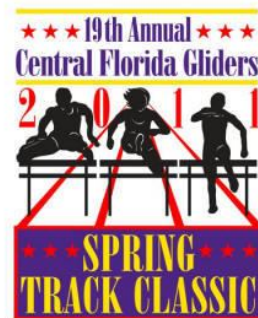
James Ellington from the United Kingdom's Trackspeed 1 team shaved time off his meet record from last year, placing first in the Open men's (born 1982-1996) 200-meter dash with a time of 21.21. **John Yarborough** broke the long-standing Open men's record for the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 13.78. Four runners—**Jeff Mack** and **Will Crawford** from Drive Phaze track club, **Daren Welborn** from St. Cloud Track and Field team, and **Marlon Williams**—topped the 2010 record for the Masters (born 1981 and before) men's 100-meter dash. Jeff Mack set the new meet record with a time of 11.38.

Records were established in a new event for the Spring Track Classic meet, the 1500-meter racewalk. Winners were **Raleigh Powers**, Bantam (born 2001-2002) girls age group, from the Central Florida Gliders (10:29.88); **Jenna Terry**, Midget girls, from the Central Florida Gliders (8:23.44); **Kelsey Carney**, Youth girls, from Break Away track club (8:45.89); **Maite Moscoso**, Open women, from the Central Florida Gliders (6:51.36); **Juan Moscoso**, Bantam boys, from the Central Florida Gliders (8:04.17); **Harryson Heister**, Midget boys, from the Break Away track club (9:38.68); **Reginald Weathers**, Youth boys, from the Savannah-Chatham Silver Cheetahs (10:11.25); and **Brandon Kruppenbacher**, Open men, from the Break Away track club (6:54.61).
